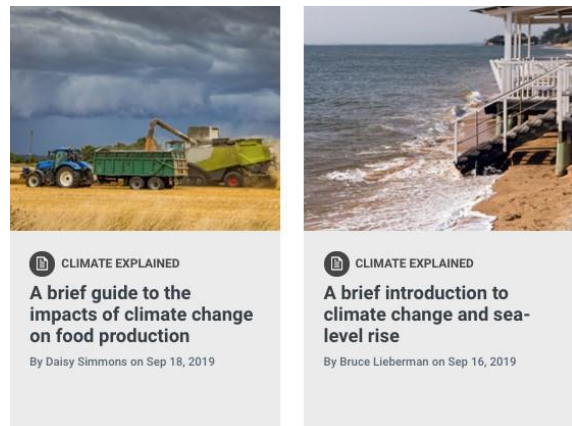


Image 1. Example Climate Explained essays on the Yale Climate Connections website.
